## What is available to assist parents?

**Diapers** – 30 each visit up to size 4, 25 for size 5 & 6, or 12 Pull Ups for children starting to potty train.

**Baby Food and Formula** – formula for babies up to 12 months

**Clothing** – sizes preemie through 4T with posted limits per family

**Toys** – clean toys to assist in development (batteries are not given or replaced)

**Equipment** – strollers, infant seats, swings, booster seats and more depending on availability. Car seats are not given.

**Expectant moms** may get items for their baby in their 8th month of pregnancy. Each is also given a 'Baby Shower in a Bag' before birth of their baby

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## Check In for Families

Paperwork consisting of names of child, mom, and dad, address, and date of birth of child is filled out on the family's first visit to the Baby Pantry. Families also sign an 'as-is' waiver regarding items and to state they will not sell any of the items they receive from the Baby Pantry. **Parents will need to show a birth certificate for their child(ren) at their initial visit to the Baby Pantry.**

## Who Can Come

Families who are experiencing tough financial times. Proof of income is not expected.



To create a positive environment for all at the Baby Pantry, it is important that families and volunteers are treated with dignity and respect. Therefore, the Baby Pantry has the following family guidelines:

- Families will respect the privacy of those seen at the Baby Pantry. Who you see and what you hear at the Pantry stays at the Pantry.
- We prefer that only the child's parents or legal guardians may get items at the Baby Pantry.
- Please take only what YOU need for your own children. Items are not to be sold if you no longer need them but can be donated back to the Baby Pantry for other families.
