

What is the Children's Trust Fund?

CTF, established in 1982, is an independent statewide non-profit organization dedicated to the prevention of child abuse and neglect. CTF serves as a voice for all children and families to promote their health, safety and welfare by supporting and funding effective collaborative programs and services that prevent child abuse and neglect. CTF's primary source of funding is the interest from a trust fund. Other sources of financial support are the Children's License Plate, tax deductible donations, fundraising, and state and federal grants. CTF currently partners with local prevention councils that serve 82 of Michigan's 83 counties.

Extensive evidence supports the common sense notion that when these Protective Factors are present and robust in a family, the likelihood of abuse and neglect diminish. Research also shows that these are the factors that create healthy environments for the optimal development of children:

- Parent Resilience
- Knowledge of Parenting and Child Development
- Social and Emotional Competence of Children
- Social Connections
- Concrete Support in Times of Need
